




What is *reportable conduct*?



Reportable conduct is when something bad happens

• to a child or young person

or



when a child or young person is around.



Reportable conduct can be

emotional harm

this means someone calls you or your
 family bad names, swears or hurts you or them



violence

 this means bad things like hitting, punching, kicking or throwing things



neglect

 this means a child or young person does not get what they need like food, a house or seeing a doctor when they are sick.



Reportable conduct can be *sexual abuse*.

This means sexual things like

 a grown up touching a child or young person's private parts



 a grown up asking a child or young person to get naked.



Reportable conduct can also be *grooming*.

This means a grown up might try to be nice to you, but for bad reasons.



They might

- give presents
- take you to places you like
- say nice things about you



• ask you to keep strange secrets with them.



They might do this because they want to touch your private parts or want you to touch theirs.

This is wrong.



If someone does something that worries you it is important to tell an adult you trust.

An adult you trust might be a parent, a police officer or a teacher at school.

The *Reportable Conduct Scheme*



The Reportable Conduct Scheme protects children and young people from abuse or harm by a DPFEM worker.



Tell someone straight away if

 you think someone from DPFEM has done something bad to a child or young person



• you feel scared by someone from DPFEM.



We take all reports seriously.



We investigate all reports and take action to stop more harm.



We will keep all of your information safe and private.





Workers must report all incidents or concerns of reportable conduct by another worker.



Reports can be made in different ways.



Go on a mobile phone or computer.

details of the worker involved



• details about what happened



• whether Tasmania Police has been told.



The *Independent Regulator* will be told when a report is made.
